



Aging Well Center's Wellness Wednesday Lectures Go On The Road

The Clearwater Aging Well Center is always looking for creative ways to further its mission: to equip Clearwater citizens to deal effectively with the changes their bodies undergo as they engage in the activities of living and as they age. Its latest initiative is called "Wellness Wednesday on the Road," a series of health-related lectures offered through its partner, Morton Plant Mease Healthcare, in community venues such as Clearwater's recreation centers and libraries.

Wellness Wednesday on the Road is an offshoot of its popular lecture series offered every third Wednesday at the Aging Well Center. Targeted to adults over 50, health topics delivered by some of the area's top medical professionals include back pain, heart health, digestive issues and treatments, diabetes and cognitive health. The series includes mini-health fairs with free on-site preliminary

screenings for many of these conditions. For those whose screenings warrant further evaluation, a wealth of resources and information on how to proceed is provided.

Wellness Wednesday on the Road seeks to expand its offerings into the community with topics that are relevant to our community's residents. Recently, the Countryside Recreation Center hosted a seminar on sleep disorders given by Lisa Whims-Squires, DO, Medical Director, Morton Plant Mease Sleep Disorders centers and in April, Countryside Library hosted a talk on memory and cognitive disorders featuring Diana L. Pollock, M.D., Board-certified Neurologist and Director of the Memory Disorder Clinic. Additional programs are planned throughout the summer alternating between those two venues.

Health starts with knowing how to be healthy, and we can be far more knowledgeable if that information is readily available within our community. Wellness Wednesday on the Road is one small step in helping people find out

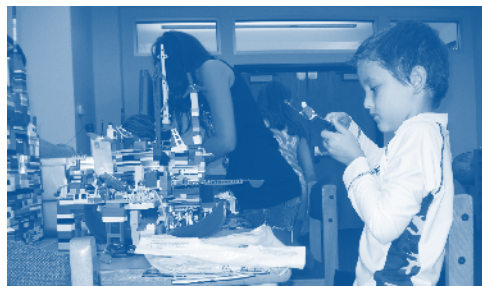

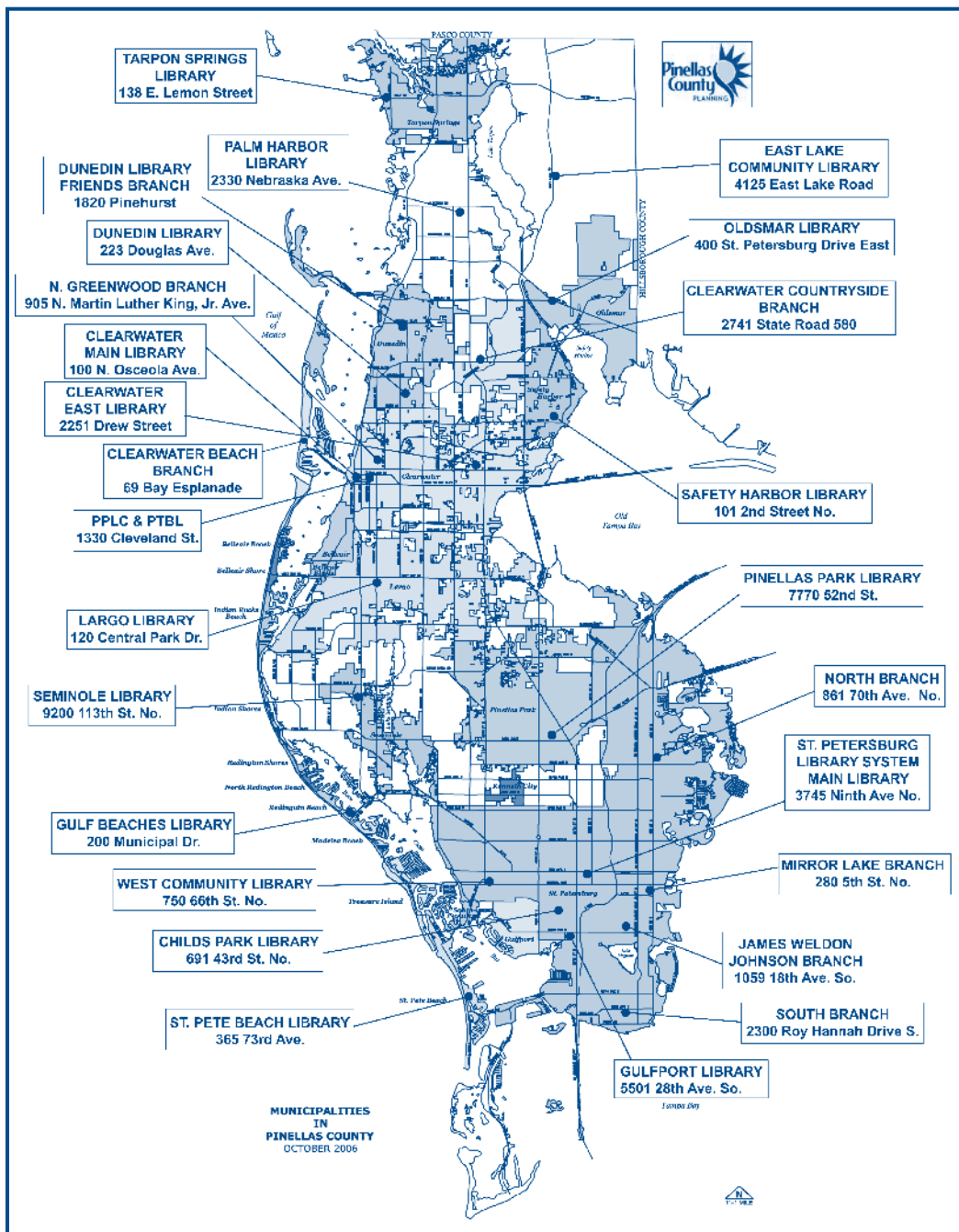

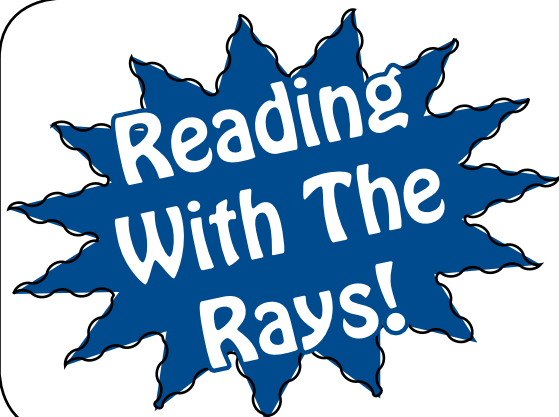
