Friends of Largo Library Reach \$1,000,000 in Fundraising

Since 1979, the Friends of Largo Library have raised and donated over \$1,000,000 for the library through book sales and other fundraisers. Over the years, their support enabled the Largo Public Library to enhance programs, collections and services. This hard working group is especially supportive of children's programs, toys and furnishings. As an example, they fund the toys for the toddler play area in the Children's wing each year. The Friends' generosity also paved the way for staff to travel to various trainings and workshops including, the annual conferences of the American Library Association Annual, the Public Library Association and the Florida Library Association. From 2003 to 2006, the Friends donated \$185,000 to the capital campaign for the new library building. In 2011, they funded

computers for the children's and teen areas. In 2013, the Friends will sponsor the new Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) system and automated materials handler costing over \$200,000. This will be their largest donation to the library to date. When approached about this latest funding request, the Friends were positive and supportive about using technology to enhance and create efficiencies in the provision of service. At a recent meeting, Friends President, Iris Shalit, recollected her own travels to library conferences in which she learned about RFID technology. The Friends have been looking for proactive ways to support staff and the daunting task of processing over 900,000 check outs and an equal number of returns each year. It is hard to fathom that the Kathryn E. Porter Book Store that graces the lobby of the new library started with humble roots. The original volunteers brought their talents and business experience to the table as the Friends embarked on their first book sales. Today over 4,500 volunteer work hours are donated in the book store retail sales area and in sorting and pricing materials. The Friends recently took responsibility for handling the initial sort of donated materials when library staff was reduced. As is typical, they did so with enthusiasm and spirit. Times have changed and so did the Friends of Largo Library. They have an online presence through sales on Abe Books, and promote quarterly book sales on various social networking outlets. The Friends are supportive of the mission of the library and quietly go about their work of laying the groundwork for future generations use of libraries.

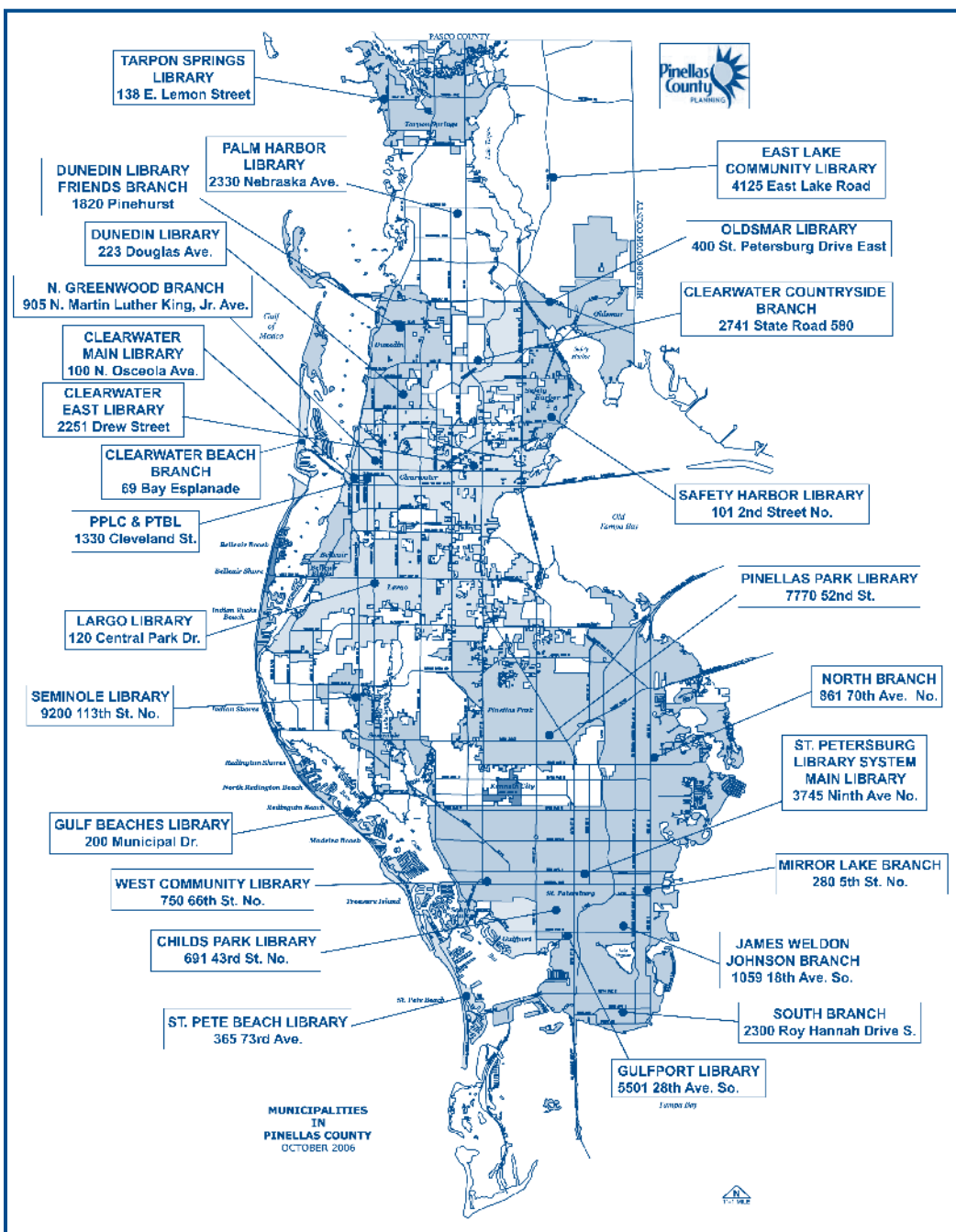
