# "STEAM-UP"

The Pinellas Public Library Cooperative's Deaf Literacy Center held a Deaf Teen camp "STEAM-UP" (science, technology, engineering, arts and math) for twenty five Deaf and Hard of Hearing high school students this past August 11 – 15, 2014. The camp was hosted at the St Petersburg College Clearwater Campus. The goal of the camp was to educate, encourage and inspire Deaf/HH teens about STEAM possible future careers as well as to foster teamwork, leadership and citizenship. Students participated in a board range of interactive STEAM activities, hands-on and math workshops and educational site visits (ConMED-Linvatec, Raytheon and ZVRS) geared toward careers in STEAM.

At the week-long camp, students were able to interact with Deaf/HH professionals like Fred Beam, a high school math instructor Jenny Locy, a Regional Outreach manager at Z Video Relay Service, Rose Hukins, a Deaf Video phone installer for Sorenson Communications and Bill Irwin, a Deaf Professional Photographer among other. The camp ended with a student lead presentation of skills learned and a trip to MOSI in Tampa.

The camp was funded by in part a St. Petersburg College National Science Foundation grant. Event community partners/collaborator include: Family Center on Deafness, ZVRS, Sorenson Communications, Invisible hands and Deaf community volunteers!
